Graduate School Information

- GPA: Maintain a high GPA. You need at least a 3.0 to qualify for most SLP graduate programs.
- Accredited Programs: Research accredited programs and application requirements at ASHA Program Directory
- Letters of Recommendation: Obtain letters of recommendation, remembering that graduate programs have different requirements for the number of letters and qualifications of letter writers. Ask your course instructors to write letters for you toward the end of the fall semester of your senior year.
- **Application Deadlines and Procedures**: Apply to graduate school(s) during the winter break of your senior year, remembering that *graduate schools have different application procedures and deadlines*.
- **Graduate Record Exam (GRE):** The graduate SLP program at Buffalo State University does not require GRE scores, however some programs do. Prepare for and take the GRE **prior** to applying to graduate school, if scores are required for the schools to which you will apply: GRE information
